too. The farm activities would apply to them too.

Don't worry too much about the curriculum guides focus more on developing their everyday skills like,

- Toileting
- Hand washing
- Putting own coat and shoes on
- Using their manners
- Speaking in sentences
- Using a cup and cutlery
- Listening to others
- Turn taking
- Counting forwards
- Use everyday household objects and toys to practice -
 - Sorting by size, colour, weight. Using the mathematical words to describe these.
 - Developing turn taking (games, sharing toys)
 - Naming objects and knowing their use
 - Positional language (behind, under, up, inside, in between, next to)
 - Imaginative play (building up stores with toys)

















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- Developing pencil control with mark making for a purpose (a card, a journey map.
- Develop fine motor skills pegging washing, pairing socks, play dough, baking, cutting, drawing, colouring, posting (coins and money boxes), threading, beads.
