History

Study Greek life and achievements and their influence on the Western world.

DT

Prepare and cook a variety of savoury dishes using a range of cooking techniques.

Understand and apply the principles of a healthy and varied diet.

Understand seasonality, and know where and how a variety of ingredients are grown, reared, caught and processed.

Understand how key events and individuals in design and technology have helped shape the world.

Music

Play and perform in solo and ensemble contexts, using their voices and playing musical instruments with increasing accuracy, fluency, control and expression.

Develop an understanding of the history of music.

Improvise and compose music for a range of purposes using the inter-related dimensions of music.

Geography

Locate the world's countries, using maps to focus on Europe (including the location of Russia) and North and South America, concentrating on their environmental regions, key physical and human characteristics, countries and major cities.

Use the 8 points of a compass, 4 and 6-figure grid references, symbols and key (including Ordnance Survey maps) to build their knowledge of the United Kingdom and the wider world.

Science

Demonstrate the dissolving, mixing and changes of state are reversible changes.

Give reasons, based on evidence, from comparative and fair tests, for the particular uses of everyday materials, including metals, wood and plastic.

Use knowledge of solids, liquids and gases to decide how mixtures might be separated, including through filtering, sieving and evaporating.
