- Homework is an important part of building positive habits towards learning, as well as consolidating and extending learning.
- You have an important role in supporting and encouraging your child to engage in homework that will allow them to flourish.

Frequency	Type	Notes	Check
Daily (10 mins)	Reading	<p>Reading is the most important homework activity that a child can do. There are three types of reading:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - You reading to your child - Your child reading to you - Your child reading independently <p>Over the course of the week, you should be engaging in all three types of learning. Just ten minutes reading a day adds up to over 60 hours of reading a year.</p>	<p>Reading Record</p> <p>The adult should record the page numbers and write one sentence in their reading record.</p>
Weekly (10 mins)	Knowledge Organiser Support	<p>For children to engage best across the curriculum and to support their development, it is important to share and support your child with the language development they will be exposed to in their learning.</p>	<p>We will be using the language and vocabulary throughout our learning. The pre-exposure to this language at home will give children a greater understanding of their topic.</p>
Weekly (20 mins)	Maths	<p>Basic mathematical understanding will ensure that children can access and deepen their understanding with reasoning and clarity.</p> <p>Over the course of the week, it is important that children are encouraged to interact with basic number facts that have been developed in school.</p>	<p>We will regularly assess children's mathematical understanding and support with different strategies.</p>
