

- Homework is an important part of building positive habits towards learning, as well as consolidating and extending learning.
- You have an important role in supporting and encouraging your child to engage in homework that will allow them to flourish.

Frequency	Туре	Notes	Check
Daily (10 mins)	Reading	Reading is the most important homework activity that a child can do. There are three types of reading: - You reading to your child - Your child reading to you - Your child reading independently Over the course of the week, you should be engaging in all three types of learning. Just ten minutes reading a day adds up to over 60 hours of reading a year.	Reading Record Your child should record the page numbers and write one sentence in their reading record. This should be checked and signed by a parent/carer every day.
Daily (10 mins)	Times Tables/Number Bonds	Rapid recall of times tables makes maths learning much easier for children, as all their brain power can focus on problem solving. The government also requires all children to know their times tables by the end of year four. This is checked by an online test.	Times Table Rockstars Your child should use TTRS to practice for a few minutes each day. Teachers will check TTRS accounts.
Weekly (10 mins)	Phonics Spellings	Pupils will learn a new spelling rule each week. They will bring home a list with words that use this rule, and should practice them using look, say (the sounds), cover, write, check.	Weekly Spelling Test Help your child write the sound and spell the whole word. Children will be tested each week.
Weekly (10 mins)	Knowledge Organiser	Each half term, your child will be provided with a knowledge organiser for their wider curriculum This is the essential knowledge that children must know to access the curriculum. We will have regular retrieval and assessment opportunities to deepen the children's understanding of the key understanding.	Retrieval Sessions End of Unit and End of Year Assessments
