

St Marys C of E School Uniform Policy

At St Marys we pride ourselves on our professional presentation. School uniform plays a valuable part in contributing to the ethos of the school and setting appropriate tone. Our Uniform Policy is to be adhered to by all pupils.

## General:

- · White shirt/blouse
- Grey trousers/skirt/pinafore dress/shorts
- Navy jumper/cardigan
- · Blue and white checked dress
- Plain white, grey or black socks/plain tights
- Black plain flat shoes/ankle boots
- · School tie
- · Hair clips, slides, headbands must be discrete and in school colours

## P.E:

- White polo shirt/plain white T-shirt
- Navy shorts
- Navy jogging bottoms
- · Navy sweatshirt
- Black pumps/trainers
- · Hair must be tied back and jewellery removed

NOTE: Your child must be able to remove jewellery themselves or must be removed at home on the day of PE in line with Health & Safety guidance. Staff will not be responsible for removing earrings.

All clothing and footwear should be clearly labelled with your child's name.

Pupils in KS2 can attend school in PE clothes on PE days—these are outlined by the school (2 set days a week).

Pupils in KS1 must attend school in uniform everyday (they will get changed for school on set PE days outlined by the school (2 set days a week).

The following items are NOT considered appropriate school wear:

- Trainers unless a PE day
- · Hoop or pendant earrings
- Nail varnish
- · High heels, platform soled shoes
- Make up
- Tattoo transfers
- Hair colour/glitter
- · Jewellery and fashion accessories

Reception class children are given a school book bag when they start. Uniform for all pupils including ties or book bags with the school logo on can be ordered via Vortex. There is no expectation for children to wear logo branded uniform in school.

School also has a bank of pre-loved clothing in school that can be accessed for free please speak to the school office, Mrs Goodyear or Miss Marsh if you would like to access this.
