Plurals					
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The plural word for 'the' in French is 'les'. We usually add a silent 's' to the noun to make it plural e.g. <i>la main - the arm</i> <i>les mains – the arms</i> 					
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Sometimes, we add a silent 'x' to the noun to make it plural e.g. <i>le genou – the knee</i> <i>les genoux – the knees</i>
