<p>Asking questions</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">In French, the words are swapped around in questions. Instead of asking 'Where do you live?', we ask 'Where lives you?' <p>Using the word 'some'</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">There are different words for 'some'. We use 'des' when we are talking about plurals, but sometimes we use the word 'some' when we are talking about one thing (like some cheese). We will use 'du' for these items. <p>Using negatives</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">When we want to use a negative in French, we put the words 'ne' and 'pas' around the verb. <p>e.g. Je mange – I eat</p> <p>'mange' is the verb.</p> <p>Je ne mange pas – I don't eat</p>	the picnic	le pique-nique	What should I be able to do by the end?
