<u>Weather</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>In French, we don't say 'What's the weather like?'</li><li>We use the verb 'fait' which means 'doing'</li><li>So we say 'What weather is it doing?'</li></ul> <u>Quel temps fait-il?</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>We also use the word 'fait' before the weather type when we are replying too.</li><li>EXCEPT when we are saying 'It's snowing.' or 'It's raining.' We don't need 'fait' because 'snowing' and 'raining' are verbs!</li></ul> <u>Ice cream flavours</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>When we are talking about flavours in French, they tend to come after the noun</li><li>For example, instead of saying 'a chocolate ice cream', we say 'an ice cream of chocolate'</li></ul> <div>une glace au chocolat ☺</div> <div>NOT 'une chocolate glace'</div> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>If we ask for a flavour that is a masculine noun, we use 'au' e.g. au citron</li><li>If we ask for a flavour that is a feminine noun, we use 'à la' e.g. à la fraise</li></ul>	<div>I would like</div> <div>an ice cream</div> <div>a chocolate ice cream</div> <div>a lemon ice cream</div> <div>a strawberry ice cream</div> <div>a raspberry ice cream</div> <div>a mint ice cream</div> <div>a vanilla ice cream</div> <div>please</div> <div>Je voudrais</div> <div>une glace</div> <div>une glace au chocolat</div> <div>une glace au citron</div> <div>une glace à la fraise</div> <div>une glace à la framboise</div> <div>une glace à la menthe</div> <div>une glace à la vanille</div> <div>s'il vous plaît</div>		<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>Identify different weather types</li><li>Ask and answer the question 'What's the weather like?'</li><li>Explore types of weather in France</li><li>Ask politely for an ice cream in a role play scenario</li><li>Give opinions of ice cream flavours</li></ul>
