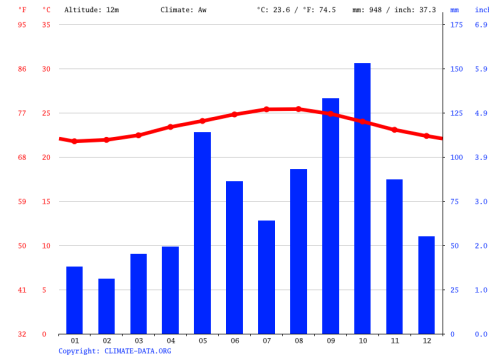

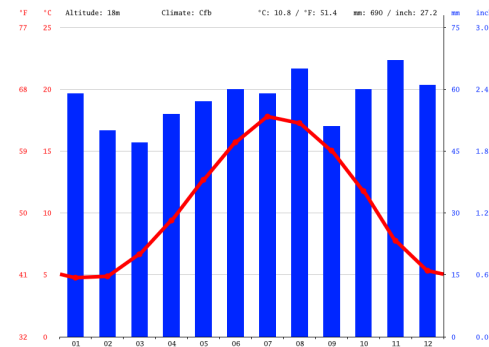

HUMAN FEATURES:

Human Features:

City, Town, Village, Factory,
Farm, House, Office, Shop.

KEY VOCABULARY:



CITY: a large town



CLIMATE: the long term pattern of weather in a particular area.



FACTORY: a building where workers use machinery to make things for sale



FARM: a piece of land used to grow crops and / or raise animals for produce



FOREST: an area mostly covered by trees that is home to lots of plants and animals.



HILL: a landform that is higher than the surrounding land and has a visible summit.



HOUSE: a building that we made for people to live in



JAMAICA: a country that is part of the West Indies in the Caribbean Sea/



MOUNTAIN: high areas of land, rising more than 600m from surrounding land



OFFICE: a place where businesses or professional work is done.



SEASONS: each of the four divisions of the year marked by their weather patterns



SHOP: a building where goods or services are sold.



SOIL: the substance where plants grow



TOWN: a larger settlement than a village



UNITED KINGDOM: an island nation made up of England, Scotland, Wales and Northern Ireland.



VALLEY: a long ditch in the Earth's surface



VEGETATION: plants, trees and flowers



VILLAGE: a small settlement with a small number of houses for a few hundred people.
